SPECIAL ASSEMBLY ON NATIONAL TRANSPORT DAY -A Special Assembly on National Transport Day was organized for the Tiny Tots of Vishwa Bharti Public School on 2nd December. The young students enthusiastically presented various modes of transport—land, water, and air—through rhymes, role play, and creative props. The colourful performances reflected their understanding of different means of transport and their importance in daily life. The assembly also helped in building confidence, improving communication skills, and creating awareness about safe and responsible travel.

SPECIAL ASSEMBLY ON GLOBAL HANDWASHING DAY- A Special Assembly was conducted on 5th December at Vishwa Bharti Public School to observe Global Handwashing Day and to emphasize the importance of hygiene and preventive healthcare. During the assembly, students were informed about the seven steps of proper hand washing and the role of cleanliness in preventing diseases. EDUCATIONAL VISIT TO HT PRESS-77 students of Vishwa Bharti School from Classes VI to IX visited the Hindustan Times Press on 23rd December at Surajpur Udyog Vihar, Greater Noida. The educational trip was accompanied by two teachers and was sponsored by *Hindustan Times* as part of the newspaper subscription taken by the students. During the visit, the students were given a detailed tour of the press and were introduced to the entire process of newspaper production. They observed how news is collected, edited, designed, and finally printed using large, high-speed printing machines. The students also learned about the use of modern technology in journalism, the importance of deadlines, and how accuracy and responsibility play a vital role in news reporting. Safety measures followed in the press and the role of different departments were also explained to them.

The experience was truly beyond the students' expectations. Seeing the massive machines in action and understanding how a daily newspaper reaches millions of readers every morning was both exciting and informative.
